Right of Way 8

The Parish Council has been asked to comment on an application to divert the footpath, ROW 8, which runs from Blaxwell Lane to Common Road.

Public Rights of Way

There are many footpaths around Whiteparish for everyone to enjoy. Currently Whiteparish does not have a dedicated rights of way volunteer group. If you find any blocked paths, broken stiles, missing waymark signs or any other problems please let the Parish Clerk know.

Dogs must be kept under effective control on public rights of way. A dog is not entitled to roam away from the path and if this does occur then the owner of the dog could be guilty of committing trespass against the landowner. Landowners may request that dogs are kept on leads.

Please also be a responsible owner and collect any dog mess up, not only to protect the shoes of other walkers, but to protect the crops or animals that may use the fields or paths after you. It is an offence to be an irresponsible owner.
