Haulage Depot, Common Road

Community Speed Watch Volunteers

The Whiteparish Community Speedwatch team urgently needs more volunteers.

The Community Speedwatch team have operated in Whiteparish since 2015, acting as a reminder to drivers to keep within the speed limit. We also have a Speed Indication Device (SID), maintained by the volunteers, which is currently mounted near the Parish Lantern. Data collected by the device, and by the team, is used by Wiltshire Police to target both repeat offenders and to carry out their own speed checks at the times of day when high speed is prevalent. Our presence is in response to residents' concerns and is a very effective way of slowing down traffic. Helping keep our community safe.

Can you spare 1 - 3 hours a month to take part in 45-minute Speedwatch sessions?

Full training takes place within Whiteparish, which includes an online training video and knowledge check and training with a Special Constable and the CSW Team Leader. Please contact the Clerk if you are interested.
