Speed Indication Devices

A Speed Indicator Device (SID) is a temporary vehicle activated illuminated sign used to display vehicle speeds with the aim to improve road safety by reducing vehicle speeds and raising driver awareness of the local speed limit.

The Parish Council has agreed to purchase two SID's for use within the village. Since 2018 it has shared a SID with Landford Parish Council which is used in partnership with the Community Speed Watch Group. The SID's are not cameras and do not record registrations. The data will be shared with Wiltshire Police to direct formal speed enforcement. The process now involves applying to Wiltshire Councils Local Highway and Footway Improvement Group (LHFIG) for approval of the locations of deployment and with financial support for installation of the posts which the devices can be mounted on.
